Attendance at performances with an asterisk (*) is a requirement for this course.

Expectations

Respect – for all people in and outside of our room, for our shared space, for our shared time, and for the music we make together.

Our choir is a team.

In order to make music together, we must act, speak, and sing with respect. Treat others how you would want to be treated.

♪ **Be prepared:**

Mentally

- Bring your best self into class from the moment you walk through the door. Enter the room with a can-do attitude and a readiness to learn and sing!
- Be real, be honest. When you're having a rough day, let Ms. Kottman know before class begins, and "check it at the door" if you can!

Physically

- Be in your seat and ready to go with your materials (folder, pencil) when the bell rings.
- No food, gum, or drinks other than water. This is primarily for your own safety.
- Go to the bathroom during passing time. Come into the Choir Room prepared to stay for a full period of music-making.

Vocally

- Recognize that others in the class are also here to learn and sing. Be aware of how you're using your voice during class (from the moment you enter the room) and adjust your volume appropriately to be respectful of others.
- Be aware of your vocal health. Every singer is essential to this team! If you're sick or losing your voice, drink lots of water, do some low humming, and try to rest your voice by not talking as much as possible. Whispering is worse for you than speaking!

♪ **Contribute in positive ways.**

- Share your ideas and your voice! Make our music meaningful; make it your own.
- Support your teammates. Singing can be really scary! We will not be successful unless we support one another at all times. This includes appropriate participation and positive attitude in classes and attending all concerts in the correct attire, ready to sing.
- Take risks in your music-making and make mistakes! Learn from them. Do not discourage another person in ANY WAY when he/she makes a mistake.
- Celebrate success – your own and the successes of our team!

Concert Attire

When we perform in professional concert attire, we show respect for each other, our music, and the work we have done to prepare for our performance. In dressing professionally, we are telling the community how proud we are to be singing together and to be representing Einstein Middle School.

Polo shirts are \$15 new (cash or check made out to Einstein Middle School) and \$0 to exchange. If you did not order a shirt at Registration, please have your student see Ms. Kottman.

Ladies: black on black

- Einstein music polo shirt
- Black bottoms: nice black pants (no jeans, leggings, or yoga pants) or black skirt with solid black leggings or tights.
Skirt length must meet school dress code expectations.
- Black closed-toe shoes: be able to stand comfortably and move quickly and easily!
- Hair should be out of face/eyes

Men: black on black

- Einstein music polo shirt
- Nice black pants (no jeans)
- Black socks, black shoes
- Hair should be out of face/eyes

Concert Etiquette

We will encourage an atmosphere of professionalism and respect at concerts. Please share the following with your concert guests as they attend our performances to support the Einstein Choirs.

We will ask our audience members to please:

- be on time to our concerts.
- stay for the entire performance.
- keep cell phones and other electronic devices off during the concert.
- refrain from using flash photography.
- respect all performers through attentive listening and appropriate applause after each piece.
- help teach young children appropriate concert etiquette by reminding them to listen quietly and escorting them out of the auditorium between selections, if needed.
- enjoy the music we are proud to share!

Local Concert Attendance and Reflection

We are so fortunate to live in a community full of opportunities to soak up fantastic music! Attending concerts can teach us about our world, inspire us as developing musicians, sustain the arts in our community, and encourage us to think about the very important role that music plays in our lives. This assignment asks you – Einstein student musicians – to be critical thinkers and coherent writers in your performance analysis and reflection.

Part of your Concert Attendance and Participation grade will include completing the following assignment:

♪ **Attend one vocal concert/event this year.**

- Local choral concerts (at area High Schools/colleges, church concerts, PAC, etc.), musicals, and operas would all count for this assignment. Solo vocal artists (classical, pop, or anywhere in between!) would be cool to see, but would not count for this assignment. If you have a question about what would count, please talk with Ms. Kottman about it beforehand!
- A schedule of upcoming local concerts can be found on Einstein Choir website.
- The performance must feature singers in at least 9th grade or older.
- Concerts attended during previous school years or over the past summer do not count.

♪ **Write a one page reflection paper on your experience**

- Paper prompts with further details are in the Choir Room and on the Choir website.

♪ **Bring in a copy of the concert program** and turn in to Ms. Kottman with your paper.

- If you forget to grab a program at the concert, please have your parent write a note as your “proof” that you attended the performance.
- Papers can be printed or shared on Google Drive.
- You may attend the concerts and turn in your paper at any time over the course of the year, as long as you have turned in your paper by Friday, May 27.

This assignment is worth 100 points at the end of the year.

50 points per concert attendance (as verified by the concert program or a parent note)

50 points per concert reflection paper (turned in to Ms. Kottman by Friday, May 27)
